Chapter members attended the Patriot Grave Markings for Major James Carter who was wounded in the skirmish at Augusta and died from his wounds on September 17, 1780 and Patriot William Skinner who served in the South Carolina Rangers and died in 1820. Both are buried in Augusta. Chapter members participated in the Color Guard and musket firing militia. Our Chapter wreath was presented by Secretary Eldon Evans.

Our Chapter Junior Reserve Officer Training Corp Committee presented in person the National Society Sons of the American Revolution JROTC medals and certificates to each outstanding JROTC cadet at separate award ceremonies at Parkview High School and North Gwinnett High School.

President Goodwin presented Chapter Certificates of Appreciation to Terry Manning for his program at our May monthly meeting and presented 12 certificates of appreciation on May 25 at the Snellville Memorial Day event to SAR members from the Coweta Falls Chapter in Columbus and Athens Chapter who will be supporting our Chapter at this event.


