President's Message:

We are making great progress in recruiting new members into the Button Gwinnett Chapter – we have inducted 15 new members through June and we have at least 7 applications in progress. We are currently at 90 members with the goal to reach the 100 member mark by the end of the year – but we are running out of time.

National & Georgia Society Sons of the American Revolution Dues increases for 2024

The National Society SAR annual dues for 2024 is increasing by \$15 to \$50 as approved by the National Society at the 2023 Congress.

The Georgia Society SAR annual dues for 2024 is increasing by \$7 to \$20 as approved by the Georgia Society BOM in 2022.

The Button Gwinnett Chapter SAR Board of Managers has voted to NOT increase annual chapter dues for 2024 – which will remain at \$20. This is where literally 100% of our chapter budget for JROTC, Patriot Grave Markings, Eagle Scout & Knight Essay and additional awards come from.

We did recently begin collecting voluntary donations for the Elisha Winn Society C.A.R. and to offset the meal expenses for our outstanding monthly meeting guest speakers. These donations are the primary reasons we are not looking to increase the 2024 Chapter Dues. 









Eagle Scout Committee Chair David Patrick





Memorial

Remembering Button Gwinnett SAR Chapter Compatriot and Color Guardsman James M. Ruff Sr. "Mike Ruff" of Loganville, Georgia, who passed on Saturday, August 19, 2017 at home. Lynn and I spent dinner with Mike at numerous Button Gwinnett Chapter meetings and I think of Mike during every meeting.









The Button Gwinnett and Piedmont Chapters of the Sons of the American Revolution, along with the Philadelphia Winn Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution in Gwinnett County, joined together as sponsors of a Grave Marking Dedication at the Georgia National Cemetery in Canton, Georgia on September 22, 2018. These Georgia societies commemorated the service of the Honored Compatriot James Malcolm "Mike" Ruff Sr. who passed away on August 19, 2017. Presentation of Colors was by the award-winning Georgia Society SAR Color Guard, led by Bill Palmer, Commander. Greetings were received from Don Burdick, President of the Georgia Society SAR, and Ann Story, Vice Chair, DAR Good Citizens Committee, NE District Georgia Society DAR, and Regent of Philadelphia Winn Chapter NSDAR. A biography and stories of Mike Ruff's life were told by Jaime Ruff, son of Mike Ruff and Registrar of the Piedmont Chapter of the SAR.

An American Flag that was flown over the United States Capitol and a Georgia State Flag that was flown over the Georgia State Capitol was presented to the family of Mike Ruff. Special thanks to U.S. Congressman Rob Woodall and to Georgia State Senator P.K. Martin for arranging the flying of these flags over their respective Capitols.

Mike Ruff never passed up an opportunity to wear his Revolutionary War militiaman attire and fire his musket. He was a true patriot, working for his family, his community, and his country. Mike served in the United States Air Force and appreciated the service of other veterans, especially disabled veterans.

Obituary for James "Mike" Ruff

James M. Ruff Sr. "Mike Ruff" of Loganville, Georgia, died on Saturday, August 19, 2017 at home. He was born on August 30, 1945 in Richmond, Indiana. He attended Berry School for Boys, South Cobb High School, and Florida Tech (now the University of Central Florida). In 1968 he married the love of his life, Bee Haight, of DeLand, Florida. Together they had two sons, James Malcolm Ruff, Jr. and Jonathan Marc Ruff.

Mike ran a successful landscaping business in Buckhead before jumping into the computing revolution in the 1970s, initially as a programmer and later as a manager of information systems. Toward the end of his career, he was in charge of computer systems for the 1996 Summer Olympics in Atlanta.

He also worked tirelessly on behalf of his family and community. He and his friend Max Borner led a PTA effort to construct an environmentally friendly playground for the local elementary school, constructed completely from repurposed materials donated by area businesses. He coached youth soccer, volunteered as a leader in the Boy Scouts of America, and was a member of the Sons of the American Revolution. He was most proud to dress up in the attire of a Revolutionary War militiaman, and loved firing his musket.

Mike was a true friend to many and always willing to sacrifice time and effort on behalf of others. A true patriot, he was proud of his service in the United States Air Force and always appreciated the service of other veterans. He had a particular love for assisting disabled veterans.

Mike never stopped doing it. Handy in his workshop, he really could do anything. He loved fishing, camping, and driving his wife and kids to interesting places.

Family will be available for visitation on Monday, August 21, at 6:00 pm and they invite you to join them in celebration of Mike's life on Tuesday, August 22, at 2:00. Both events will be at Tom M. Wages Funeral Home, 3705 US Highway 78, Snellville, Georgia.

Peter Sheaffer, my 4th great grandfather, was of German descent. His parents were Johann Balthasar Schaeffer and Anna Margaretha Gleb. He was born on 24 Nov 1751, in what was then, Philadelphia County, Pennsylvania.

While Peter was still a child, his father and his sister went scouting for new land to homestead. They were set upon and his father was killed by the Conestoga Indians around 1756, in Schuylkill, Pennsylvania.

Peter's sister was captured during the attack and taken into captivity for seven years. While captive, Head War Chief, Mahontonga, took her for his wife. Following the signing of a Peace Treaty, she was returned. Peter moved to the village of Elizabethtown and he resided there until his death on 08 May 1848.

Peter served three tours of duty during the Revolutionary War. In 1776, at age 25, he was drafted, into the Militia in Lancaster County, PA. He served under Captain George Gantz's Company, Colonel Gonegan's Regiment. Following his first tour, he was later drafted into Captain McGee's Co. While on duty, he marched and guarded 300 Hessian prisoners from Lebanon to Middleton. Following his second tour of duty, he enlisted in 1777 in Captain Robinson's Co. and fought in the battles of Brandywine and Germantown. At the end of the war, he returned again to civilian life in Elizabethtown, PA.

Following his service in the Revolutionary War, Peter had a tavern on Market Street in Elizabethtown. He also served as the Constable in Mt. Joy, Lancaster, PA and was a member of the Christ Evangel Lutheran Church in Elizabethtown, PA. He owned a two story log house on High Street which measured 30' by 25' with a carpenter shop on the lot. His son, Fredrick, took over the business and is listed as an innkeeper in 1825.

After the war Peter lived alone in his later years, and kept house in Elizabethtown, PA. He asked his neighbors to keep an eye on a certain window of his house. If they saw a red handkerchief hanging in the window, they would know he was sick and needed help. One morning the neighbors saw the handkerchief. They went to his aid and found him very ill. It proved fatal in a short time as recounted in The Middletown Press, 1887 by his daughter, Magdalena Schaeffer Boggs, on her 104th birthday.

Peter Sheaffer, one of the oldest living Revolutionary War veterans, died in Elizabethtown on 08 May 1848 at age 98. He was buried Wednesday, 10 May 1848 with full military honors in the Christ Evangel Lutheran Church cemetery. Three bands played at his service, The Jackson Infantry Band, the Swalora Infantry Band and the Elizabethtown Band.. A procession of several thousand citizens and friends marched through the streets of the borough to the Lutheran Cemetery, where he was interred. Col. A. Greenwalt served as marshal. The funeral ceremonies excited the liveliest interest, and were in the highest degree solemn and impressive. (Elizabethtown Chronicles 1848)

Peter Schaffer was born in 1751 to Johann & Maria Schaffer in the Eastern Welsh Mountains of Pennsylvania. The two parents came from Germany in 1748 and were part of a large German population that migrated to and settled in Pennsylvania. This was part of the Appalachian Mountain range that was populated by Conestoga Indians and there was hostility because of the influx of settlers. Johan was eventually killed and scalped by these Indians, and his daughter was captured by them and held for seven years. His son Peter survived with his mother.

At the beginning of the Revolutionary War in 1776, Peter at age 25, was drafted in the PA militia under George Gantz in Col. Hannigan's regiment. His unit marched 180 miles through Lancaster Pennsylvania on their way to Philadelphia, Trenton, Perth Anvoy, and eventually the New York City area. He was stationed at Fort Paulus Hook in New Jersey, and at Governors Island, where he stood guard there.

The Battle of Long Island, or the Battle of Brooklyn Heights, was fought on August 27, 1776. It was a defeat for General George Washington and the Continental Army, that had to evacuate and retreat to Manhattan Island. "On the night of August 29-30, Washington evacuated the entire army to Manhattan without the loss of supplies or a single life."

Later, Patriot Peter Schaffer was drafted again into Captain McGee's unit in Lebanon PA., where they guarded Hessian prisoners. He served a third tour in 1777 and fought again at Brandywine & Germantown, two more disappointing battles to the Continental Army.

This information was obtained about Peter Schaffer from deposition he gave when applying for a pension.

During his third tour during the war, he married a woman named Catherine and they ended up having 10 children. Peter lived to be 97 years old and upon his death, his funeral services which were held outside the church because of the number of people that came to his funeral.

The Button Gwinnett SAR Chapter was recently informed of the upcoming burial ceremony for Korean War Soldier U.S. Army Sgt. 1* Class James L. Wilkinson who will be buried with Full Military Honors in Barrow County on September 16, 2023. More details will be shared as they become available.



Soldier Accounted For From Korean War (Wilkinson, J.)

The Defense POW/MIA
Accounting Agency (DPAA)
announced today that U.S. Army
Sgt. 1st Class James L.
Wilkinson, 19, of Bowden,
Georgia, who was killed during
the Korean War, was accounted
for Dec. 5, 2022.

In July 1950, Wilkinson, was a member of G Company, 2nd Battalion, 9th Infantry Regiment, 2nd Infantry Division. He was reported missing in action during fighting along the Naktong River near Yongson, South Korea, on Sept. 8. Due to the fighting, his body could not be recovered at that time, and there was never any evidence that he was a prisoner of war. The Army issued



a presumptive finding of death on Dec. 31, 1953.

In July 1951, the Army began recovering remains from the area and temporarily interring them at the United Nations Military Cemetery (UNMC) Tanggok. One set of remains recovered during this period was designated Unknown X-1588. After extensive analysis by the Central Identification Unit-Kokura in Japan was unable to identify X-



1588, the remains were declared unidentifiable. They were later sent to Hawaii where they were buried at the National Memorial Cemetery of the Pacific, known as the Punchbowl, in Honolulu, with other Korean War Unknowns.

In July 2018, the DPAA proposed a plan to disinter 652 Korean War Unknowns from the Punchbowl. On March 25, 2019, DPAA disinterred Unknown X-1588 as part of Phase Three of the Korean War Disinterment Project and sent the remains to the DPAA laboratory for analysis.

To identify Wilkinson's remains, scientists from DPAA used dental and anthropological analysis, as well as chest radiograph comparison. Additionally, scientists from the <u>Armed Forces Medical Examiner System</u> used mitochondrial DNA (mtDNA) analysis.

Wilkinson's name is recorded on the Courts of the Missing at the Punchbowl, along with the others who are still missing from the Korean War. A rosette will be placed next to his name to indicate he has been accounted for.

Wilkinson will be buried on Sept. 16, 2023, in Barrow County, Georgia

George Washington Print

State Regent Betty Harrah and Georgia SAR State President David Ludley have announced a collaborative plan to provide a SAR information table at the DAR Fall Forum in Macon on September 28-30. DAR members will have the opportunity to receive a limited edition, artist-signed, and numbered print of "George Washington in Savannah 1791."

The original painting was completed by well-known historical artist Jeff Trexler of Pennsylvania and hangs in the NSSAR Headquarters in Louisville, KY. The painting was commissioned for the SAR National Congress that was held in July 2022 in Savannah.

This is the only painting that exists of George Washington's 1791 visit to Georgia and only a few of the original 200 prints remain. The artist personally signed and numbered prints in the 16x24 size, which are available with a donation of \$110.00. The smaller 10x12 size is available with a donation of \$35.00. The smaller prints are not numbered as they are electronically signed by the artist. To make a donation, you may use cash, a personal check made payable to GASSAR, or a credit card.

With either size received, a printed historical narrative of the print and a certificate of authenticity from the artist will be provided. For each print acquired during Fall Forum, GSSDAR will receive a monetary donation from GASSAR.
