Bio Mary Hamilton Williams - Martha Stewart Bulloch Chapter Immediate Past Regent

Mary Williams is a storyteller with roots in public speaking.

Over 25 years ago, during a weekend storytelling retreat, she realized that she'd rather tell stories than give speeches. She has performed at the Carter Library, the Southern Order of Storytellers Winter Festival, the Magnolia Storytelling Festival, Roswell Holiday Storytelling, Roswell Tellabration, was the "storyteller in residence" for Camp Cheatham Hill in Marietta and has shared stories in schools, churches, and civic organizations as far away as central Florida.

She is a Past President of the Southern Order of Storytellers Board of Directors.

She began her speaking journey by joining Toastmasters 36 years ago, earning her Distinguished Toastmaster certification in 1992. She served as the District Director for the state of Georgia, 1998-1999, and served on the Toastmasters International Board of Directors, 2000-2002, representing the southeastern United States. While serving Georgia's Toastmasters, she met her husband, Steve, who is also a Past District Director.

Mary is the immediate past Regent of the Martha Stewart Bulloch Chapter, Daughters of the American Revolution. She serves the Georgia State Society as the NW District Director, the Public Relations and Media Chair and is part of the Georgia State Society Speaker's Staff.

She retired in 2018 after almost 45 years of working in the computer field in everything from programming to social media.

# Medals and Certificates to Present:

SAR Silver 250th Anniversary Medals Tom Jacques & Ray Kyle (Requires 25 Bronze & 60 Silver)

Silver Semiquincentennial (250th Anniversary) Recognition Medal – The medal is designed to encourage and recognize those compatriots, chapters, and societies to participate in local, state, national, and international events that publicly educate, recognize, honor, and celebrate the heroes of the American Revolution. Participation involves the planning and execution of these events, as well as attendance. The medal covers the celebration of any event's 250th anniversary where said event related directly to acts of resistance to British attempts to coerce

the residents in America: from the first Parliamentary Acts protested after the conclusion of the French and Indian Wars, through the armed struggle of the American War for Independence, to the ratification of the Treaty of Paris by the Continental Congress. This therefore will cover any public celebrations in the Period from 2014 to 2033.

# Bronze Roger Sherman Medal - Don McCarty working on the Gold 250 Medal (235 points required)

The Bronze Roger Sherman Medal may be awarded to a compatriot in recognition of, and in appreciation of, outstanding services rendered to a Chapter. The medal is presented to a compatriot for significant service which lacks the requirements for the Meritorious Service Medal. It should be awarded in place of the Bronze and Silver Good Citizenship Medals, which cannot be awarded for service to the SAR. The recipient must have served

as an active officer for a minimum of two years, as an active committee chairman for three years, or as an active member of a committee for four years.





# Lydia Darragh Medal - Lynn Baxter Jacques

The Lydia Darragh Medal may be awarded by the incumbent President General, Vice President General, State Society President or Chapter President to the lady who has provided significant service to him during his term. The medal will recognize the assistance of the ladies who work behind the scenes supporting SAR programs, but whose service does not meet the requirements for the Martha Washington Medal. It may only be presented once per year at the discretion of the President General, a Vice President General, a State Society President, or a Chapter President.

# SAR Medal of Appreciation - Sue Ford

The SAR Medal of Appreciation may be presented to a member of the DAR in good standing in recognition of and in appreciation for outstanding services rendered to the SAR. The award may recognize assistance in forming new SAR chapters, obtaining a specific number of new SAR members, or otherwise significantly aiding the SAR programs.

# DAR Hannah White Arnett Bronze Medal - Thomas Leo Jacques

The Hannah White Arnett Medal is one of DAR's newest recognitions. It may be awarded to a member in good standing of the Sons of the American Revolution (SAR) or Sons of the Revolution (S.R.) for unselfish devotion, tireless efforts, and assistance to the DAR; and who has dedicated his time, energy, talents, and/or resources to the organization in support and furtherance of the DAR mission of historic preservation, education and patriotism.

The bronze medal is awarded at the chapter level. State Societies award the silver medal, and the gold medal is awarded by the National Society.
