National & Georgia Society Sons of the American Revolution Dues increased for 2024

The National Society SAR annual dues for 2024 is increasing by \$15 to \$50 as approved by the National Society at the 2023 Congress.

The Georgia Society SAR annual dues for 2024 is increasing by \$7 to \$20 as approved by the Georgia Society BOM in 2022.

The Button Gwinnett Chapter SAR Board of Managers has voted to NOT increase annual chapter dues for 2024 – which will remain at \$20. This is where literally 100% of our chapter budget for JROTC, Patriot Grave Markings, Eagle Scout & Knight Essay and additional awards come from.

The SAR Gold 250th Anniversary Medals were presented to Ralph Galpin & Don McCarty



Gold Semiquincentennial (250th Anniversary) Recognition Medal - The medal is designed to encourage and recognize those compatriots, chapters, and societies to participate in local, state, national, and international events that publicly educate, recognize, honor, and celebrate the heroes of the American Revolution. Participation involves the planning and execution of these events, as well as attendance. The medal covers the celebration of any event's 250th anniversary where said event related directly to acts of resistance to British attempts to coerce the residents in America: from the first Parliamentary Acts protested after the conclusion of the French and Indian Wars, through the armed struggle of the American War for Independence, to the ratification of the Treaty of Paris by the Continental Congress. This therefore will cover any public celebrations in the Period from 2014 to 2033.

The SAR Medal of Appreciation may be presented to a member of the DAR in good standing in recognition of and in appreciation for outstanding services rendered to the SAR. The award may recognize assistance in forming new SAR chapters, obtaining a specific number of new SAR members, or otherwise significantly aiding the SAR programs.

Bio Leslie Strickland Watkins

Leslie Strickland Watkins, a native Atlantan, is retired from teaching language arts, public speaking, debate, and independent study courses following a 32-year career in public education. As a debate and public speaking coach, Leslie was honored as a three-diamond coach of the National Speech and Debate Association, a national honor society of debate students and coaches, and is a member of the Georgia Debate Coaches Hall of Fame.

She is a member of the Chestatee River Chapter, National Society Daughters of the American Revolution where she serves as parliamentarian, chair of the DAR/SAR/S.R. Committee, chair of the Bylaws Committee, and vice chair of the Commemorative Events Committee and America 250! Committee. She's previously served the DAR as various chapter committee chairs, corresponding secretary, vice regent, regent, and honorary regent, as well as state chair for two committees and Northeast District Director of Chapters. She is a graduate of the NSDAR Members Course, Committee Leaders Course, and New Horizons Leadership Course, each course broadening her knowledge of and service to daughters and their communities. Leslie has been a co-presenter of the Sons of the American Revolution Traveling Trunk Program since 2010 with members of three SAR chapters and has co-delivered the program to over 27,000 fourth grade students. She is committed to keeping American Revolution history alive by participating in Patriot grave markings, battle commemorations, and naturalized citizen ceremonies, and is honored to be the only woman trained to serve as a member of the Rabun Gap Artillery Field Command, working either as wormer/rammer or fuse igniter during cannon firings with the Joseph Habersham Chapter SAR.

Leslie is also a member of the National Society Daughters of Founders and Patriots, National Society Sons and Daughters of Pilgrims, the First Georgia Company of Jamestowne Society, Order of Descendants of Ancient Planters, Daughters of American Colonists, and Colonial Dames XVII. She serves as a state officer in two of these groups.

She's been honored by the VFW with the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States Citizenship Education Award, received accolades from three Sons of the American Revolution Chapters, as well as Georgia State Society Sons of the American Revolution, including a two-time recipient of the GSSAR Nancy Hart Education Outreach Award, numerous medals, and oak leaf clusters. She's a past president and past parliamentarian of the Georgia Society Sons of the American Revolution Ladies Auxiliary, and currently serves the Georgia State Society, NSDAR, as Northeast Vice Chair of the America 250 Committee and a member of the State Speakers Staff.

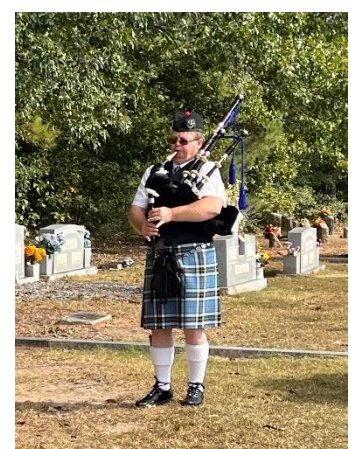

On October 1st President Tom Jacques and Compatriot Ralph Galpin attended the Compatriot Grave Marking for Larry David Guest, Winterville, GA in Militia and Continental uniforms. The ceremony was sponsored by the Athens Chapter Georgia Society Sons of the American Revolution and the Elijah Clarke Chapter National Society Daughters of the American Revolution

The ceremony was held in Winterville, GA at 10 AM, Sunday, October 1, 2023 at the Winterville Cemetery on Parkview Road in Winterville, Georgia 30683. The Color Guard was led by National and Georgia Color Guard Commander Scott Collins. Georgia SAR Sr. Vice President Edward P. Rigel, Jr brought greetings on behalf of the Georgia Society. Commander Collins and Button Gwinnett President Tom Jacques fired a three-round musket salute and performed the mourn musket ceremony. 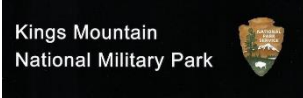

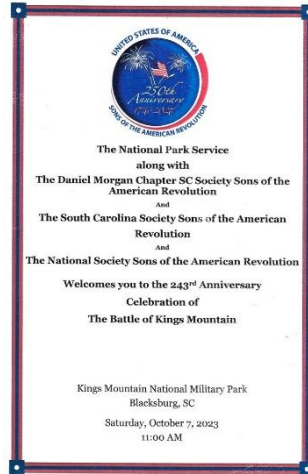

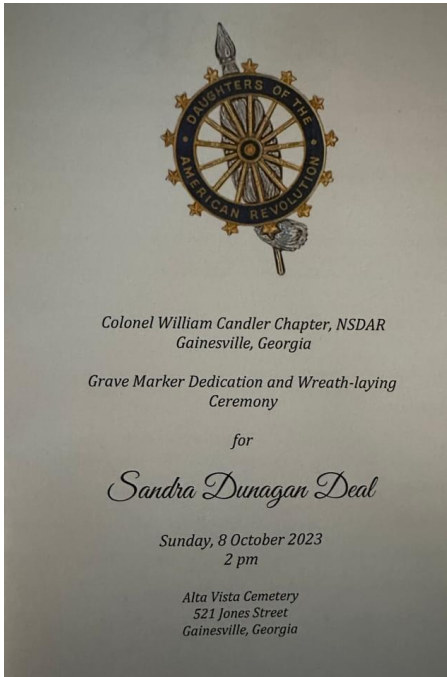

This was a wonderful ceremony that was planned by Bruce Maney, Eldon Evans, and Don McCarty. We had over 110 members and guests in attendance including 26 members of the Color Guard – 9 from the Button Gwinnett Chapter. Rev. Melissa McNair-King Fairview Church Pastor welcomed all attendees and performed the Invocation and Benediction on a beautiful day. Church members did a tremendous job of preparing the cemetery grounds, assisting with the setup and cleanup of flags, tents, and chairs and even allowing attendees to participate in a BBQ fundraiser lunch they were having. The Georgia SAR Color Guard was commanded by Ed Rigel Jr. and the Militia was led by Sid Turner. Greetings were brought by: Rev. Melissa McNair-King Fairview Presbyterian Church Pastor, Georgia SAR President Dr. David Ludley, Past NSSAR President General Larry Guzy, Georgia DAR 1st Vice Regent Helen Powell, Georgia C.A.R. Understanding the Mourn Musket Salute

The Mourn Muskets Salute is a solemn tribute to a fallen Revolutionary War Patriot. It consists of bringing the muskets to Present Arms, then the command, "Mourn Muskets" begins a slow lowering of the musket barrel downward which stops with the placement of barrel on the shoe. Next, the militiamen place both hands on the musket stock bottom, lowering their heads to the hands in a position for prayer. Once the militiamen are in their prayer position, the benediction begins. The Militiamen remain in that position for prayer of benediction. After the benediction, the command, "Recover Musket" begins the upward lifting of the musket to the present arms position, then order arms, as the Militia returns its muskets to stand ready to fire again another day.

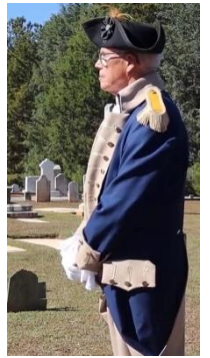

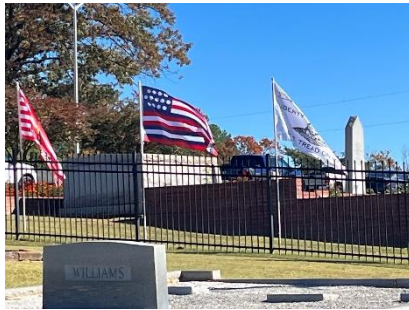

Biography of Patriot John Bagby

Presented by: Phyllis Davis, a descendant of Patriot John Bagby, Past President of the Gwinnett Historical Society, and member of the Philadelphia Winn Chapter, Daughters of the American Revolution, will give the biography of John Bagby, whom we honor today.

I have the honor today to share with you a biography of my ancestor, John Bagby, a Revolutionary War Patriot, who is buried here, next to the headstone of Patriot Philip Isely, together in this field resting forever, in the Fairview Presbyterian Church Cemetery.

Before I begin to speak with you about John Bagby, I want to tell you that this cemetery was not the only field that Patriot Philip Isley and Patriot John Bagby shared during their lifetime. Two hundred and thirty-two years ago, in March of 1781, on the field of battle, during the Battle of Guilford Courthouse, present day Greensboro, North Carolina, both Patriot John Bagby and Patriot Philip Isley fought the British.

British General Charles Lord Cornwallis's Army came face to face with the Continental Army under the command of Major General Nathaniel Greene. The importance of their bravery at the Battle of Guilford Courthouse in the American Revolution was that it caused the War to come to an end. British Commander Cornwallis lost a quarter of his army in this one battle. Seven months after the Battle of Guilford Courthouse, King George's British forces surrendered to General George Washington's Army at Yorktown, Virginia, on October 19, 1781.

Today, we honor the dedication these two Patriots who gave for our liberty and freedom for all.

The biography for John Bagby begins with his birth in 1751 in Hanover County, Virginia, and his marriage to Elizabeth Martin in North Carolina. After the Revolutionary War, around 1787, John Bagby moved to North Carolina. There are various records and land documents that mention John Bagby in Wilkes County and Surry County. The documented sale of John Bagby's land in North Carolina is recorded in 1818. John Bagby and his two sons, Thomas M. Bagby and Edmund Bagby migrated with their families from Wilkes County, North Carolina to Gwinnett County between 1820 and 1830.

A three-year residency was required to be eligible to participate in the 1827 Georgia Land Lottery. On May 15, 1827, John Bagby, a Revolutionary War Soldier in Gwinnett County, in Captain Moore's District, drew land in the new part of Georgia, known as Muscogee County, Section 148, District 4. John Bagby appears for the first time in Georgia on the 1830 U.S. Census for Gwinnett County.

In 1832, John Bagby applied in Gwinnett County Inferior Court at the age of 75, to file his Revolutionary War Pension application which was written and submitted to the War Department by William Maltbie, the first clerk of the court in Gwinnett County. William Maltbie was the

husband of Philadelphia Winn Maltbie. The Philadelphia Winn Chapter Daughters of the American Revolution is the oldest DAR Chapter chartered in Gwinnett County, and today is a co-sponsoring Chapter of this Grave Marking Ceremony.

On March 1, 1837, Patriot John Bagby died and was buried here in the Fairview Presbyterian Church Cemetery. Unfortunately, there is not a lot of Georgia information available about John Bagby to tell you, but he left a legacy of individuals who have lived in Gwinnett County for approximately two hundred years, and have made their homes here, and started families, who still honor and respect his Patriot Heritage. John Bagby's son, Thomas M. Bagby and his family moved to Cherokee County, but his son, Edmund Bagby and wife, Nancy Anne Martin Bagby settled in the Island Ford area near the Buford Dam. Five of their daughters and two sons moved to Gwinnett with their parents, and married and raised their families here. These families include Bagbys, Garners, Moulders, Kennedys, Benefields, Hoschs, Baileys, and too many others to mention.

The year following his father's death, Edmund Bagby died on September 25, 1838, and was buried in the Island Ford Baptist Church Cemetery in Sugar Hill, Gwinnett County, Georgia. His widow, Nancy Anne Bagby, age 71, died in January 1850, and was buried beside him in the Island Ford Cemetery. Four of their daughters, Mary Bagby Garner, Elizabeth Bagby Kennedy, Sarah Carolina Bagby Moulder, Nancy Bagby Benefield, and son Benjamin Bagby are also buried near their parents. Their fifth daughter, Martha Bagby Moulder, is buried nearby in the Sharon Baptist Church Cemetery in Forsyth County, Georgia. My father, Ralph Jackson Garner, was born on October 19, 1918, within two miles of the location where the Edmund Bagby family lived near Richland Creek. It is very fitting that in observance of the historical 1823 year, the 200th Anniversary of the Fairview Presbyterian Church, we gather in 2023 to honor the valor of Patriot John Bagby, and Patriot Philip Isley with your attendance at their Patriot Grave Marking Ceremony. Thank you!

Biography of Patriot Philip Isley

Presented by: Rex Isley, a descendant of Patriot Philip Isley, a retired Colonel in the United States Army, and author of “The Malachi Isley Story,” will give the biography of Philip Isley, whom we honor today.”

It is an honor to present the biography of my Great-Great-Great-Great Grandfather, Philip Isley.

Philip was born circa 1754 in Pennsylvania. He was the son of Melchior and Mary Magdalene Carlin Eisele. Melchior Eisele was Anglicized to Malachi Isley. When Philip was an infant, circa 1754-1756, the family moved from Pennsylvania to Orange County, North Carolina. They settled near present-day Friendship United Methodist Church in south Alamance County—this part of Orange County became Alamance County in 1849.

Philip volunteered to serve as a Light Horseman in the Revolutionary War. This period of service was short. In the later part of 1777, he was drafted. During this period, he served in the Infantry. He participated in three major battles: Battle of Camden (South Carolina), 16 August 1780; Battle of Guilford Courthouse, 15 March 1781; and Battle of Eutaw Springs (South Carolina), 8 September 1781.

The Battle of Camden was a disaster for the Americans and resulted in the relief of General Gates as the Southern Commander. Nathaniel Greene followed Gates as the Southern Commander and led the fight at Guilford Courthouse and Eutaw Springs. Guilford Courthouse was the War’s turning point leading to the American victory at Yorktown.

We do not know the location of Philip’s house but his land was just to the north of Friendship Church. He paid taxes on three horses and 11 cows in 1780. In 1816, he paid taxes on 414 acres of land. We do not know the name of his first wife. They had 5 children: Martin Isley, born 21 June 1780; Jacob Isley, born circa 1782; Mary Polly Isley, born circa 1785; George Isley, born 1783-1786 in Orange County, NC; Sally Polly Isley, born 30 September 1795.

On 20 March 1816, Philip married Mary Ann Cameron in Orange County, North Carolina.

In 1822, Philip, his wife Mary Ann, and his son, George, moved from Orange County, North Carolina, to Gwinnett County, Georgia. His daughter Mary Ann Isley was born in Gwinnett County in 1822. On 9 August 1823, Philip and his wife, Mary Ann, were founding members of the Fairview Presbyterian Church, where we now stand.

In the 1830 Gwinnett County Census, one male 10-15, and two males 20-30 are listed as members of Philip’s household in addition to Philip, his wife, and daughter. These three additional males were probably Philip’s son, George, and two of George’s children.

Under the provisions of the Revolutionary Claim Act of 7 June 1832, Philip began the process for his Revolutionary War Pension by his testimony on 25 September 1832. He clarified this testimony by more testimony on 25 July 1833. He was issued a Certificate of Pension on 13 September 1833 in Lawrenceville, Georgia, with an effective date of 4 March 1834. He was approved for receipt of \$30.00 per year. Also in September 1833, he was paid \$75.00 in arrears to 4 September 1833 plus \$15.00 for the partial year, for a grand total of \$90.00.

Philip executed his Last Will and Testament on 5 August 1840, leaving all his worldly possessions to his wife, Mary Ann. He died at his residence in Gwinnett County, Georgia, on 9 March 1842, leaving what was left of his plantation and property to his wife. While we do not know for certain, it is likely that Philip was buried in this cemetery.

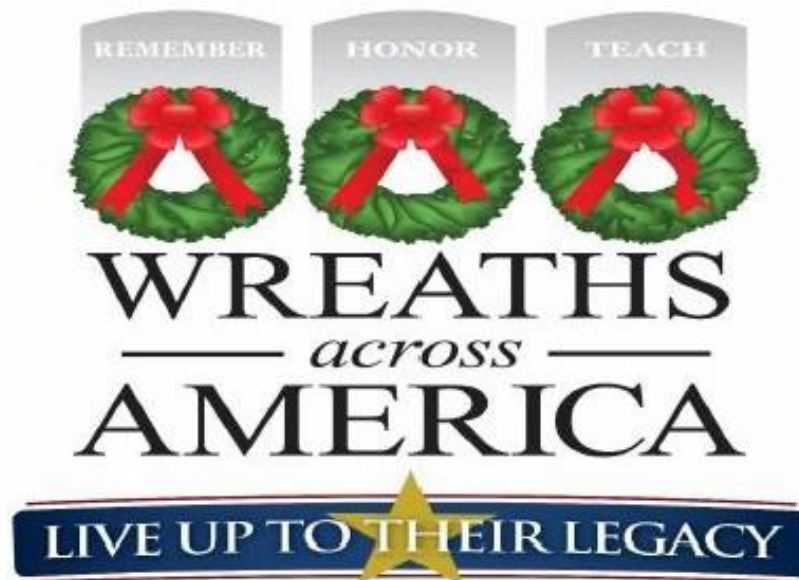
