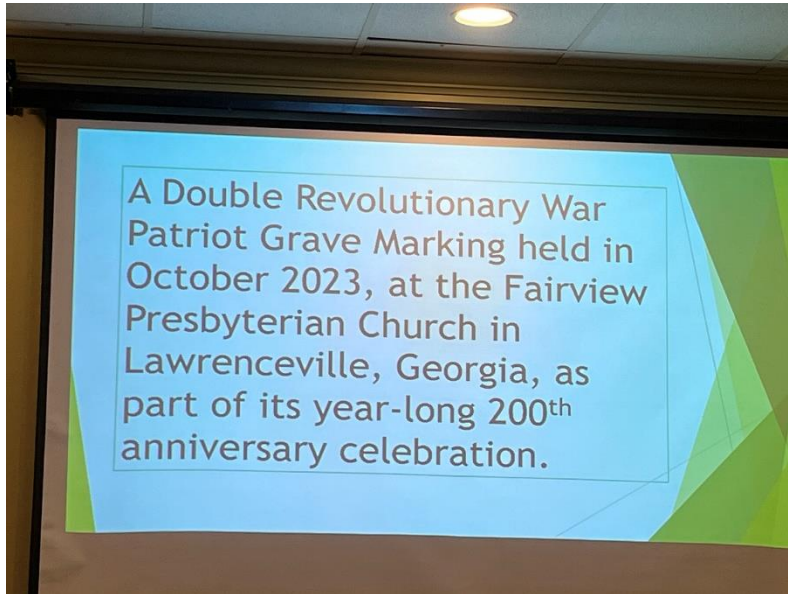
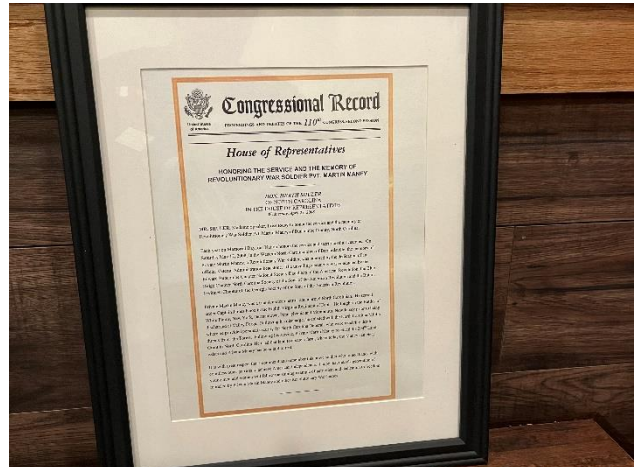

Much of Bruce's presentation focused on the Double Patriot Grave Marking on October 21, 2023 at Fairview Presbyterian Church in Lawrenceville for John Bagby and Philip Isley sponsored by the Button Gwinnett Chapter. Bruce highlighted the documentation used to prove the service of both of these patriots and proving the location of their burial in Gwinnett County. Bruce also shared a U.S. Congressional proclamation that had previously been done for his Patriot Ancestor Martin Maney.



Bruce and Eldon Evans who assisted Bruce with the powerpoint presentation were each presented with SAR Certificates of Appreciation by Button Gwinnett Chapter 1st VP Ray Kyle.

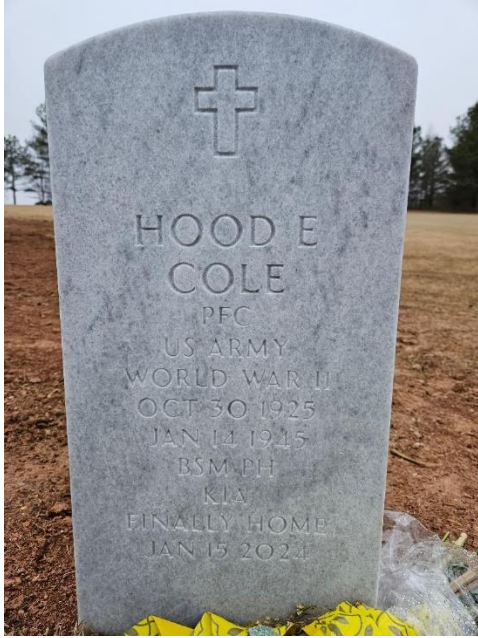
On January 13, 2024 Several Members of the Button Gwinnett Chapter participated in the Georgia National Cemetery wreath removal. They were President Tom Jacques, 1st Vice President Ray Kyle and Compatriot James Walters. For the last two years I have participated in the cleanup in Section 16 - but I didn't realize until January 15th that this was the section that Button Gwinnett Compatriot and Color Guard member Mike Ruff was buried and where we had performed his Compatriot Grave Marking. In the five years since we marked Mike's grave on September 22, 2018 - this section has grown from several rows to nearly filling the entire section. Mike's wife Bee is the lady in the sunglasses. She was a Philadelphia Winn Member and is now also at Georgia National with Mike.



On January 15, 2024 Three Members of the Button Gwinnett Chapter along with Georgia SAR Veterans Committee Chairman Gary J. Hoyt participated in the Memorial Service at the Georgia National Cemetery for WWII PFC Hood Cole who was KIA in France on January 14, 1945 - that included full military honors. Button Gwinnett SAR members in attendance were President Tom Jacques, 1st Vice President Ray Kyle and Compatriot James Walters. Soldier Accounted for from WWII (Cole, H.)
WASHINGTON -

The Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency (DPAA) announced today that U.S. Army Pfc. Hood E. Cole, 26, of Atlanta, Georgia, killed during World War II, was accounted for Feb. 22, 2023.

In January 1945, Cole was assigned to L Company, 3rd Battalion, 276th Infantry Regiment, 70th Infantry Division. On Jan. 14, Cole was killed in action when his unit was attacked by German forces near Baerenthal, France. At some point during the fighting, Cole was killed, but historical records do not indicate exactly where. Due to the fighting, his body was unable to be immediately recovered.

Beginning in 1947, the American Graves Registration Command (AGRC), the organization that searched for and recovered fallen American personnel in the European Theater, searched the area around Baerenthal. None of the investigations uncovered any leads regarding the disposition of Cole's remains. He was declared non-recoverable on May 11, 1951.

DPAA historians have been conducting on-going research into Soldiers missing from combat around Baerenthal and found that X-9441 and X-9442 Frankfurt Mausoleum, buried in Ardenne American Cemetery, an American Battle Monuments Commission site in Neupré, Belgium, could be associated with Cole. X-9441 and X-9442 were disinterred in April 2018 and transferred to the DPAA Laboratory at Offutt Air Force Base, Nebraska, for analysis.

To identify Cole's remains, scientists from DPAA used anthropological and dental analysis. Additionally, scientists from the Armed Forces Medical Examiner System used mitochondrial DNA (mtDNA) and Y chromosome DNA (Y-STR) analysis.

Cole's name is recorded on the Walls of the Missing at Epinal American Cemetery in Dinozé, France, along with others still missing from WWII. A rosette will be placed next to his name to indicate he has been accounted for.

Cole will be buried on January 15, 2024, in Canton, Georgia.

Three Georgians To Be Honored At Rites Sunday

Three Georgians who were killed in action will be honored in memorial services held at their respective churches Sunday.

Memorial services for Pfc. Hood E. Cole, of Atlanta, who was killed in action in France Jan. 14, will be held at 3 p. m. at the Bellwood Baptist church.

Pfc. Hood is survived by three sisters, Mrs. Grace Garmon, Mrs. Frances Farr and Mrs. Emma Corley,* of Atlanta, and a brother, Pvt. Wiley N. Cole, in Italy.

Entering the service Feb. 5, 1944, he was assigned to the infantry and received his training at Camp Blanding, Fla., and Ft. Leonard Wood, Mo. He had been overseas since last December. He

attended Kingsbery school and Maddox Junior High.

Memorial services for Pfc. Grover L. McIntosh, 20, who was killed in action Jan. 12 in Belgium, will be held at 2:30 p. m. at the First Baptist church, Smyrna, with the Rev. E. B. Awtry officiating. Frank McMillan will be in charge of the music.

Pfc. McIntosh is survived by his parents, the Rev. and Mrs. H. B. McIntosh, of Smyrna; a sister, Miss Agnes McIntosh, of Smyrna, and a brother, Pvt. A. L. McIntosh, at Camp Polk, La.

In the service since April, 1943, he left for overseas the following November, and participated in the Normandy invasion. Friends, and especially those in uniform, are invited to attend the services.

Memorial services for Pvt. Marion W. Taylor, of Smyrna, who was killed in action Jan. 6 in Belgium, will be held at 4:30 p. m. Sunday at the Smyrna Presbyterian church.

Survivors include his wife; a son, Billy Taylor; a daughter, Mary Joe Taylor; his mother, Mrs. H. O. Taylor; two sisters, Mrs. Louise T. Pavlovsky and Miss Mary Frances Taylor, of Smyrna, and four brothers, Gordon K. Taylor, of Miami; Charles A. Taylor, of Decatur, and John M. Taylor and Robert H. Taylor, both in the Navy.

Bronze NSSAR Color Guard Medal – The Bronze Color Guard Medal is for service at the State and/or Chapter levels. Each medal is awarded for at least three years of service at the applicable level. The three years may be broken, not continuous. Award of each medal may be for retroactive service, so that any living compatriot may receive it, even if he cannot march anymore.

Harold Ford - Received the President General Robert G. Vance Membership Trophy

Georgia Society re-established the PG Robert B. Vance Sr., membership trophy in 2002 to honor President General Robert B. Vance Sr. This trophy is awarded to a Compatriot of the Georgia Society who has shown total dedication in sponsoring new members for the Georgia Society, Sons of the American Revolution. The award is a Gold Bowl mounted on a wood pedestal with a miniature minuteman on each corner, the Society logo, and inscribed with the following: President General Robert B. Vance, Sr. Membership Trophy Georgia Society Sons of the American Revolution.

It is presented annually at the annual meeting awards luncheon to the Georgia Society member in good standing who has the greatest number of first-line sponsorships of new members to the Georgia Society for the previous calendar year. Honoring History and Service

Editor's Note: This solemn and impressive ceremony was a fitting tribute to two Revolutionary War veterans who were early settlers of Gwinnett County and died here.

In continuing with its Bicentennial commemoration from August 13, the Fairview Presbyterian Church in Lawrenceville hosted grave markings on October 21 for two of the four Revolutionary War Patriots buried in the 200-year-old church cemetery. This event was sponsored by the Button Gwinnett Chapter SAR, the Philadelphia Winn Chapter DAR, the Blue Ridge Mountains Chapter SAR and the Robert Forsyth Chapter SAR.

Georgia known as Muscogee County. Following John Bagby's death in 1837, he was buried in the Fairview Presbyterian Church Cemetery.

The biography of Patriot Philip Isley was read by U.S. Army Colonel (retired) Rex Moody Isley of Arab, Alabama, the great-great-great grandson of Philip Isley, a Patriot who fought in three major battles: Battle of Camden, Battle of Guilford Courthouse and Battle of Eutaw Springs. In 1822, Patriot Isley moved from North Carolina to Gwinnett County, where he and his wife Mary Ann became founding members of the Fairview Presbyterian Church in 1823. Patriot Bagby was issued a Certificate of Pension in Lawrenceville in 1833 and died at his Gwinnett County home in 1842.

The graves of Revolutionary War Patriots John Bagby and Philip Isley were marked in the ceremony at Fairview Presbyterian Church in Lawrenceville. These two men fought together during the Battle of Guilford Courthouse in 1781, which many believe was a turning point in the Revolutionary War.

The biography of Patriot John Bagby was given by Philadelphia Winn Chapter DAR member and past GHS President, Phyllis Davis, the great-great-great-great granddaughter of Patriot Bagby, who migrated from North Carolina with his family to the newly organized Gwinnett County in the early 1820s. In 1827 John Bagby was eligible to participate in the Georgia Land Lottery, resulting in receiving land in a new part of

Participating in this ceremony were members of the Georgia Society SAR Color Guard and Militia, the Elisha Winn Society C.A.R., the Button Gwinnett Chapter SAR, the Philadelphia Winn Chapter DAR, the Gwinnett Historical Society, Fairview Presbyterian Church and additional lineage organizations and chapters from all areas of Georgia. A Patriot Grave Marking is a service conducted by the Sons of the American Revolution honoring a Patriot from the American Revolution with an unveiling of a new grave marker. The service involves elements from a U.S. military or church funeral and may include the wishes of the Patriot's family, the SAR Chapter sponsoring the event and the church where the grave is located.

The SAR and DAR Chapters provided full honors for the Patriots at the October 21 ceremony, including the SAR Color Guard in attendance to present, post and retire colors; the SAR Militia to present a 3-musket volley and a SAR Color Guard member playing TAPS to end the ceremony.

Mourn Muskets is a solemn tribute to fallen Patriots and is performed during the benediction of a grave marking. The movements are as follows:

- The militia is brought to attention and the order given to Present – Arms.

The command is then given to Mourn-Muskets. The militiamen slowly rotate the muskets so that the muzzles are pointing straight down with the end of the barrel resting on the militiamen's left toe. The left hand is placed on the musket butt followed by the right hand. The head is then bowed to rest on the hands. This position is maintained during the benediction.

After the benediction, the command is given to Recover – Muskets. The procedure is then reversed by raising the head; removing the hands to the former position on the musket and raising the musket to the present-arms position, all in slow motion.

The command Order – Arms ends the movement. ☼

Cemetery

On a sunny day in October, one of our GHS members cleaned up the Hubbard Rowden Family Cemetery located off Killian Hill Road. It is a small cemetery but fairly visible from the road. The hard part was getting the lawn mower up the steep hill to reach the burial area! It's a very small cemetery but quite overgrown. With lots of weeds wacked and the tall grass gone, the cemetery shows that it is respected and remembered. Just in time for Veterans Day, Hubbard Rowden's grave that honors his War of 1812 service looked so much better.

Also, there is Rowden's wife Parnella, his two daughters Rebecca and Susan, and "The Covered Wagon Girl" who died in approximately 1855. Her family was traveling in a wagon train when the girl became ill and passed away. According to the story, Mr. Rowden offered

her parents the opportunity to bury their daughter in the Rowden family cemetery near his daughter and they did. Unfortunately, no one ever recorded her name or her family's, so this small part of Gwinnett's huge history is missing a detail.

The Gwinnett Historical Society appreciates any individual, family or organization who is willing to take on maintaining a small family cemetery with no living family members to keep it up. 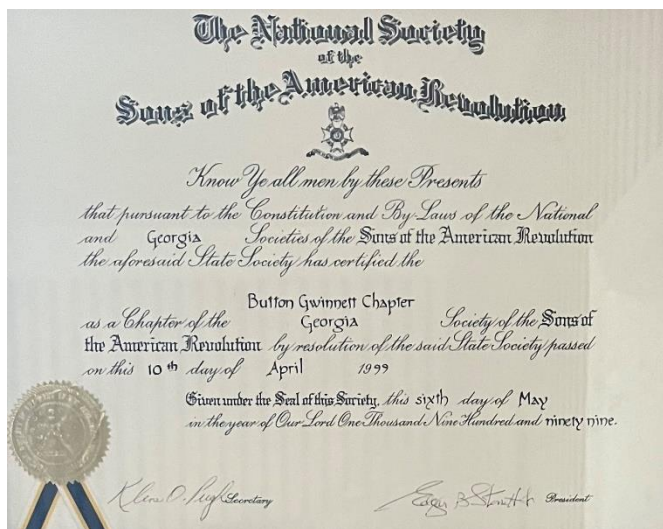
