
August 17, 2024 - 242nd Anniversary of the Battle of Blue Licks, Kentucky

Joseph Kershaw Chapter President John Goodwin. This was the first trip that Philadelphia Winn Honorary Regent Lynn Baxter Jacques and I have made to Camden.

REVOLUTIONARY WAR COMES TO CAMDEN

Camden, South Carolina's oldest existing inland town, was founded in 1732 as part of King George II's plan for eleven townships in the interior of the state. It was originally known as Fredericksburg Township. By the 1750s, a group of Irish Quakers and other emigrants from England, Scotland, and the northern colonies were moving into the frontier settlement.

By 1768, the town, then being called Pine Tree Hills, had become the state's most important inland trading hub. It was again renamed Camden after Lord Camden, the defender of colonial rights in British Parliament.

The Revolutionary War came to Camden on 1 June 1780, when Lord Charles Cornwallis and 2,500 troop took over Camden and established the main British supply post for the 1780-1781 Southern Campaign. Camden remained strategically the most important and the largest of the five principal inland garrisons maintained by the British during the campaign.

Cornwallis returned to Charleston leaving Lord Francis Rawdon in command. Camden was highly fortified with four redoubts and encircled by a wide palisade fence. Joseph Kershaw's house, commandeered by Cornwallis as his headquarters, was also fortified, as was the nearby powder magazine that Kershaw had built for the State of South Carolina.

On August 13, upon hearing of the march to Camden by a patriot army led by General Horatio Gates, Cornwallis returned to Camden to engage Gates. On August 16, the two armics clashed 9 miles north of Camden, resulting in the worst American battle defeat of the war.

Cornwallis remained in Camden until September 8, then headed north on the campaign trail, leaving Rawdon in charge of the British troops and garrisons in the South (some 900 hundred were garrisoned at Camden, housed in rough huts made from Camden's shops and churches).

A month later, Cornwallis was stunned by the defeat of a large contingent of British at Kings Mountain, then another large detachment was decisively defeated at Cowpens in January 1781. After a debilitating win against General Nathanael Greene, now commander of the rebuilt Continental Army, at Guilford Courthouse in March, Cornwallis headed north to Virginia.


Greene returned to South Carolina intent on removing all occupying forces and garrisons (he eventually captured all the British posts and some 3,500 prisoners). At the Battle of Hobkirk's Hill on April 25, Rawdon defeated Greene in his attempt to recapture Camden. The win proved costly to the British, and within weeks they had destroyed much of the town and evacuated. Greene went on lose at Ninety-Six in May and Eutaw Springs in Spetember before triumphantly entering Charleston as the British were leaving the harbor in 1782.

Today, the Camden Battlefield is a National Historic Landmark and owned by the Historic Camden Foundation.


Do you Qualify for the National Society Sons of the American Revolution War Service or Military Service Medals?

As part of the Button Gwinnett SAR Chapter 25th Anniversary Celebration to be held on April 6, 2024 we would like to recognize our Chapter Compatriots who served in any branch of the U.S. Military by presenting you with either the National Society Sons of the American Revolution War Service Medal or Military Service Medal if you have not previously received either of them from our Chapter.

Compatriots Bill Palmer and Bruce Maney have agreed to be Co-Chairs of the Veterans Medal Committee.

In accordance with the NSSAR Official Handbook, Volume V: Individual Medals, Awards and Certificates, updated January 1, 2024, pages 17 and 18, shown below, <u>Proof of Military Service (DD-214 form)</u> must be presented by the member to the Chapter Secretary, who will determine the Chapter Member's eligibility for the War Service Medal or Military Service Medal.





- 1. SAR Badge
- 2. Minuteman Medal
- 3. Gold Good Citizenship Medal
- 4. War Service Medal
- 4. Military Service Medal
- 5. Heroism Medal
- 6. National Society Medal of Distinguished Service



NSSAR Handbook V: War Service Medal - Proof of Service:

Proof of service, in the form of a copy of the member's discharge (or other U.S. or Allied Government proof in the case of a member in active service), must be presented to the NSSAR Veterans Recognition Committee, State Society Secretary or Chapter secretary (depending on presenting authority) before the medal can be purchased and/or worn. Such proof must show that the Compatriot:

1. served, or is serving, honorably in: a. the armed forces of the United States, b. the military forces of a country allied with the United States, or c. a United Nations Peace Keeping Force; and

2. served against a common enemy in a war or action recognized by a branch of the Armed Forces of the United States; and Effective: January 1, 2024 - 18

received a campaign medal, combat ribbon or badge as shown on the DD-214 form (or equivalent).

Bronze bars are available indicating service in WWII, Korea, Vietnam, Southwest Asia, Kosovo, Iraq, Afghanistan, and the Global War on Terrorism.

<u>Subsequent Presentation Authorized:</u> A Compatriot may receive additional Bronze Service Bars or Oak Leaf Clusters for subsequent qualifying war service.

Note: The National Defense Service Medal is not considered a campaign medal for purposes of qualifying for the War Service Medal.

NSSAR Handbook V: Military Service Medal - Proof of Service:

Proof of service, in the form of a copy of the member's discharge (or other U.S. or Allied

Government proof in the case of a member in active service), must be provided to the NSSAR Veterans

Recognition Committee, State Society Secretary or Chapter Secretary (depending on presenting authority) before the medal can be purchased and/or worn.

Such proof Effective: January 1, 2024 - 19 - must show that the Compatriot:

1. served, or is serving, honorably in the armed forces of the United States,

2. the military forces of a country allied with the United States, or

3. a United Nations Peace Keeping Force.

<u>Subsequent Presentation NOT Authorized:</u> A Compatriot may receive this medal only once. Oak leaf clusters or other ribbon attachments are not authorized.
